

What 'remote learning' can I expect from Fritwell Primary School?

This information is to be used as a general guide and parents can expect further details of remote learning for their child as and when it is required. We aim to implement remote learning as soon as possible. There are 3 general scenarios outlined below.

The government's Oak Academy online lessons can be used for remote learning for every year group, covering a wide range of curriculum objectives. <https://www.thenational.academy/>

Circumstance	Remote learning
My child is unwell with COVID symptoms or another illness and is absent or is sent home from school.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● No remote learning is set. ● If your child begins to feel better, let us know and we will begin the remote learning process.
My child is absent because they are awaiting test results or is required to self-isolate. The rest of their class are attending school and being taught as normal.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Maths lessons uploaded to Microsoft Teams, following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. This may be a combination of White Rose maths videos (the scheme used in school), the screens shared in the classroom (PowerPoint) and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. Answers will be provided for self-marking at home if available and work can be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Microsoft Teams for feedback. ● English tasks uploaded to Microsoft Teams following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these will be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Microsoft Teams for feedback. ● Topic task(s) following the lessons being covered in class that week. This may be the screens from the lesson being uploaded onto Microsoft Teams along with resources / worksheets (if appropriate i.e. if the resources required for the lessons are already at home). If the lessons being taught in class are not able to be delivered remotely (e.g. if it requires additional resources such as art resources e.g. clay or pastels, or geography resources e.g. maps and atlases) then alternative 'topic' learning will be set on Microsoft Teams which may make use of the Government's 'Oak Academy' lessons. ● EYFS activities will be set through Tapestry and will cover the different areas of Early Years Curriculum.
My child's whole class is not permitted to attend school because there are multiple children in their class have tested positive for Covid-19. We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Maths lessons uploaded to Microsoft Teams, following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. This may be a combination of White Rose maths videos (the scheme used in school), the screens shared in the classroom (PowerPoint) and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. Answers will be provided for self-marking at home if available and work can be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Microsoft Teams for feedback. ● English tasks uploaded to Microsoft Teams following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these will be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Microsoft Teams for feedback. This will include spelling, grammar, writing and reading. ● Small group video learning which will look different depending on the age of the children. This may be guided reading sessions, maths sessions or writing sessions delivered by the class teacher*. The sessions will run throughout the

* the video learning sessions will not be facilitated by your child's class teacher if the teacher is the one experiencing Covid symptoms or they are unwell. We know our parents will understand that the health and wellbeing of our children, families and staff is paramount.

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	<p>hours of the usual school day in small groups. The frequency of when your child's sessions will occur will be communicated by your child's class teacher via Microsoft Teams. All sessions will be set up through Microsoft Teams.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Topic task(s) will be uploaded to Microsoft Teams for children to complete and hand in virtually. This will be lessons your child would have had in class this term which can be most easily adapted to remote learning.● 1:1 support if your child receives 1:1 support and they are isolating, a more bespoke programme of support will be set up. This may include phone calls / video chats with your child's 1:1 support. They will usually be expected to still complete the learning set on Microsoft Teams.● EYFS activities will be set through Tapestry and will cover the different areas of Early Years Curriculum.
